#### TOWER LAKES HOA ANNUAL MEETING

The Tower Lakes HOA held its annual meeting on July 30th at the Berean Baptist Church on Middle-Bellville Road. Board President Gary Anania welcomed over a hundred residents (representing 101 buildings) to listen to several guest speakers, along with the current board, talk about the state of things in Tower Lakes.

**Brandon Hunsinger**, managing partner of Hunsinger Builders, started things off by showing a map of the upcoming Phase 5 of the development. He indicated that the new area will include 14 doubles and 15 singles. While engineered to extend Cape Cod all the way back out to Straub Road, that will not happen initially.

He currently expects asphalt work to be complete by Thanksgiving, though as always in construction, weather may play a role. In response to a question, he committed to doing what he can to control the dust affecting residents nearest to the work.

Independent agent **Brian Hamilton** addressed the group about insurance. He pointed out that the HOA's bylaws were incorporated as part of the policy. He reiterated that the HOA's policy covers from the drywall out, while the owner's policy was responsible from the paint in. And he clarified that in case of a claim, the carrier (Auto-Owners) pays the HOA because that's the name on the policy. The HOA then writes a check to

the owner. It seems like an extra step, but must happen that way for legal reasons.

Brian offered to review any owner's policy to make sure there was no gap in coverage between the HOA's and the owner's policy, even if that owner's policy was not through his agency.

Treasurer **Melanie Riggleman** reviewed the financial results with the group. At least part of that information is posted on the password-protected portion of the website.

**Tom Studer** noted that 54 variances had been processed in the last year, with changes to landscaping being the most frequent request. Variances must be approved prior to work being done. Forms to submit a variance are available on the website, under the Forms tab.

Board member Chris Baldasare reviewed beautification efforts over the

past year, including a walkaround to identify projects. The gazebos will be pressurewashed and re-stained in the near future.

Chris also explained the process the tree committee is working through to add more trees to the community. With bids coming in, he noted that prices for trees have risen dramatically, while the actual availability of trees has fallen. Pending board approval, he hopes to see plantings in the fall, though it could extend to next year

**Gary Anania** discussed issues related to lawncare, including the extremely wet spring. He noted that this is year one of a three-year contract with the mower vendor, who continues to struggle to find and retain workers at an affordable rate. He pointed out that our contract essentially cost \$12.00 per mow per yard, far less than what it would cost to contract someone to mow a single yard. **Snowman John Grove** reminded residents that for the last couple months he has collected bagged yard waste at the Farmhouse, then hauled it to the Cairns Road site. He will be there again at the end of August.

John also noted that while the average snowfall in Mansfield is 49 inches, it was only 10 inches last winter. He talked about some of the issues the new snow vendor had last year. That vendor will have a better understanding of the community's expectations this year.

Joe Petrycki noted that while Mansfield ranks in the top ten most dangerous places to live in Ohio, there is not much to do in terms of Neighborhood Watch, because we've had no issues with crime in Tower Lakes. He expects to focus his committee's educational efforts on cybersecurity over the next year.

Joe credited Melinda and Dave Kunkel for revising and maintain the website, which is now an information source for all residents.

**Vice-President Bill Leffel** noted that over the past year the Farmhouse had undergone a safety inspection by the Fire Department, had a thorough cleaning of the basement, and had replaced the eighteen-year-

old furnace. Wi-fi service was added, along with a television donated by resident Dave Kunkel.

In addition to social events and daytime card games, Bill noted that the Farmhouse had been rented 21 times by residents. He pointed out that the form to reserve the building is on the website.

Gary Anania asked members of the Social Committee to stand for a special round of applause in recognition of the job they had done during the year coming up with events to spur a sense of community at Tower Lakes.



Following the board presentations, the board announced the election results. Our accounting firm, Banks & Associates CPAs, counted 69 absentee ballots, which were added to the 67 ballots counted at the meeting. The proposed change to the bylaws passed. The newly elected board then held an organization meeting, with individual responsibilities assigned as shown on the front page of this publication.
